



## **ICOPLAST Young Plastic Surgeons Mentorship Program**

**1 September 2026 - 31 December 2027**

The ICOPLAST Young Plastic Surgeons Mentorship Program establishes structured mentorship to advance educational leadership, institutional governance, and clinical innovation. Structured mentorship has been shown to be critical to producing the next generation of competent, passionate, and successful surgeons, with impacts on research productivity, leadership attainment, and career satisfaction.

Rapid changes in healthcare and technology threaten to outpace traditional training models, making proactive leadership development and creation of a pool of skilled young plastic surgeons is essential.

### **Objective**

The objective of the Young Plastic Surgeons Mentorship Program is to connect plastic surgeons across all career stages – trainees, young plastic surgeons and senior faculty - to foster collaboration through a unique team-based model. By bridging diverse perspectives, the initiative creates a continuous, long-term learning environment where every participant has the opportunity to both lead as a mentor and learn as a mentee.

### **1. ICOPLAST Young Plastic Surgeons Mentor**

To become an ICOPLAST Young Plastic Surgeons Mentor, you must:

- Be member of an ICOPLAST National Society in good standing
- Hold Board Certification for at least 10 years
- Have demonstrated leadership in plastic surgery (Program Director, Head of Department, Plastic surgeons with active academic engagement and recognized expertise in their field)
- Submit evidence of publications and scientific presentations

### **ICOPLAST Young Plastic Surgeons Mentor provides:**

- 2 to 4 weeks hands-on and/or observership experience within your team, providing clinical participation in a daily structured program in a respectful learning environment
- On completion of the mentorship period, the Mentor will provide the Mentee with constructive feedback and advice
- On completion of the mentorship, the Mentor will also provide ICOPLAST with feedback on the experience

### **Credits for ICOPLAST Young Plastic Surgeons Mentors:**

ICOPLAST Young Plastic Surgeons Mentors will be credited on the ICOPLAST website, in our Newsletter, on social media and will be also considered for inclusion in the Mentorship Program Presentation at the ICOPLAST World Congress.

### **Application to become an ICOPLAST Young Plastic Surgeons Mentor**

Complete and return the Young Plastic Surgeons Mentor Application together with support documentation by 31 July 2026.

## 2. ICOPLAST Young Plastic Surgeon availing of Mentorship Opportunity

To apply for an ICOPLAST Mentorship, you must:

- Be a senior resident (final year of an accredited plastic surgery training program) or a board-certified plastic surgeon (within 0–5 years of completing training), affiliated to an ICOPLAST National Society in good standing
- Be available to travel to and actively participate in a 2-to-4-week mentorship program
- Have clear objectives for participation in the ICOPLAST Membership Program

### **ICOPLAST Young Plastic Surgeons Mentee obligations:**

- Participate fully and positively in all aspects of the program provided by the mentor
- On completion of the mentorship period, the Mentee will provide ICOPLAST with feedback on their experience for inclusion on the ICOPLAST website, in our Newsletter, on social media
- Be considered for inclusion in the Mentorship Program Presentation at the ICOPLAST World Congress.

Complete and return the Young Plastic Surgeons Mentorship Application together with support documentation by 31 July 2026.
